

Stabilization Community Benefits
Agreement that requires
contractors to hire Alameda County residents to work on certain
construction projects. So, if you are unemployed, foster youth, formerly incarcerated, homeless/unsheltered, or on any public assistance, do NOT let any of those things stop you!

Keep Your Workplace Safe!

Practice good hygiene



Limit hand shakes and try to use **non-contact greeting methods**



Clean hands at the door and schedule regular hand washing reminders

Skilled Trade of the Month: Painters & Allied Traders

Minimum Qualifications:

18+

High School Diploma or GED Driver's License or Valid Photo ID Social Security Card

Application Process:

Applications are accepted year-round

Call training center in advance to register for testing

Bring required documents and complete application on test date

Pass 1-hour standard math exam

Applicants for Floor Layers must pass a 2-hour test covering shapes and mixed fractions

Pick up signatory contractor list from a local union office

Find employment with a union contractor

Once hired, email signed sponsor letter to appapp@dc16jattf.org

Within first 6 months of starting a job, new workers will be scheduled for an orientation and apprenticeship classes

Program Length:

60 months with exception of 48 months for Tapers

Additional Requirements:

-Applicants with limited English proficiency must take an ESL course at the training center within 6 months of starting the apprenticeship program

Painter applicants must pass a color blindness test

Approx. Hourly Wages:

Starting Apprentice: \$18-\$21 Journey-Level Worker: \$45-\$53

Alameda County Apprenticeship Updates

IBEW Local 595 Electrical Workers of Alameda County are accepting applications starting January 2022!

- 1. Read the application announcement and requirements on the JATC website [https://www.595jatc.org/application-announcement].
- Get all required documents.a. Photo I.D. such as a driver's license or ID card issued by the DMV
- b. Proof of high school
 graduation, GED, or 2-year
 Associate Degree (or higher)
 c. Sealed official high school
 transcript
- Request a sealed transcript from your high school (do not open)
- Algebra requirement: The transcript must show at least one year of high school algebra with a passing grade of "C" or better
- Accepted alternates: Sealed transcript showing at least one semester of a post highschool algebra course with a passing grade of "C" or better OR a certificate of completion from NJATC Tech Math online training course (more info on JATC website).
- 3. Go to training center to submit documents and fill out application. All required documentation should be submitted within 10 business days after application date.
